- 20 Our students had excellent performances in a series of renowned competitions:
 - The chemistry research team of our school (Edmond Lui (5A), Tommy Yuen (5D) and Sipo Wai (7D)) participated in the World Final of the Intel International Science and Engineering Fair. With the outstanding project named "Polyaniline Multi-detecting Toxic Gas Sensor", they were successfully awarded the Second Place Grand Award and the entitlement of three minor planets named after them.
 - Five of our S5 students won the First Runner-up, the Food Science Award and the Best Booth Presentation Award in the Hong Kong Student Science Project Competition 2011-12 with their project titled, "The Racemization of Amino Acids Under Different Cooking Methods".
