- The first ever mentorship programme jointly organized by King's College and the King's College Old Boys' Association will be launched in the coming November. It aims at enhancing the holistic development of students and building supportive mentoring relationships between the mentors (alumni) and mentees (students).
- \diamond Job shadowing opportunities for our S.5 students
 - Under the New Academic Structure (NAS), Other Learning Experiences (OLE) is one of the three components that complement the core and elective subjects for the whole person development of students. Schools have to offer students a range of OLE opportunities encouraging them to participate in the five areas of OLE, namely Moral and Civic Education, Community Service, Career-related Experiences, Aesthetic Development and Physical Development.
 - The "King's College Job Shadow Programme" was established by the Careers Committee of King's College in 2010 with the support of the King's College Old Boys' Association. It aims to broaden students' horizon by exposing them to an authentic work environment through matching students with alumni from different professions. Throughout the past three years, 208 students were benefitted from this programme.
